

# “BEWARE OF CHECK SCAMS”

## POTENTIAL CHECK SCAM


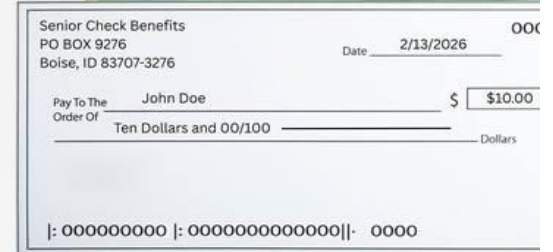
If you receive a letter/check/call from “Senior Check Benefits”

### Do NOT:

- Call the number provided
- Deposit the check (it can be part of a fraud chain)
- Give out SSN, DOB, banking info, or Medicare number

### Do:

- Ignore or discard the mailing
- Report it to the SSA Office of Inspector General
- If you're unsure about the benefits, contact SSA directly using the official number from [ssa.gov](http://ssa.gov) - not the one in the mailing.



Be aware of “**Senior Check Benefits**” checks being mailed to individuals in Alabama. The “**Senior Check Benefits**” scam involves fraudulent, unsolicited checks mailed to seniors, often accompanied by letters promising insurance or government benefits to trick them into sharing personal bank details or paying fees. These checks are fake and designed to steal identity or money through aggressive sales tactics. Depositing the check could put you at risk of sharing your personal information.



Contact your local Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) if you have received a Senior Benefits check.
